Simple Tips for Successful Funding Bids

Tell a great story

Funders don't just want facts and figures—they want heart! Stress the importance of the arts and live theatre for your young people- how many of your young people see their first live show through school?

Make it easy to read

Nobody likes wading through walls of text. Use short sentences, bullet points, and clear headings. If your application looks like a nightmare to read, it'll get skimmed—and that's bad news for your funding chances.

Show 'em the numbers

Emotion grabs attention, but data seals the deal. How many people will benefit? What's the return on investment? Funders love cold, hard numbers that prove their money is working hard.

Triple-check the details

Nothing kills a bid faster than silly mistakes. A missing budget breakdown? Game over. Get a fresh pair of eyes to review everything before you hit SUBMIT!
